






- ➤ The Los Lunas Gun Club (LLGC) Range is located on the east side of highway 6 approximately 10 miles west of Interstate 25.

- > There is no running water or electricity at the range



Flags

There are flags at all ranges and at the end of the main drive – The main flag should be left attached to the main flagpole and raised when shooters are on the range. The last shooter will lower the main flag when leaving the range

Flags can be found in mailboxes located near the flagpole

- All firearms must be cased when walking up to any range
- Clearing areas are provided to unload firearms
- Concealed carry firearms –unload prior to approaching firing line
- Do not handle or touch any firearm during cease fire (includes target changes)
- Treat all firearms as loaded
- Keep finger off the trigger until you are ready to fire
- Never point a firearm at anything you are not willing to destroy
- Know your target and what is beyond





PISTOL RANGE

- Only Pistol caliber firearms to be used at this range
 - .22 caliber allowed including .22 caliber rifles
- Must shoot from behind bench
- Drawing from a holster is not permitted on this range
- Markers on the ground set at 7, 15, 25 and 50 Yards
- Ensure targets are set so bullets impact the berm
- Use only authorized targets at the pistol range
 - No exploding targets, steel targets, plastic or glass bottles allowed
- Pick up and dispose of spent casings
 - Brooms and dustpans provided
 - Use plastic buckets for brass casings
 - Dispose of .22 brass
- Target stands and frames can be found in the Con-x
 - Return them when finished shooting
 - Members are required to bring own targets





- Less restrictive ranges
- Holster draw allowed
- Tactical rifles and shotguns allowed
- Good for CCW or multiple target practice
- Place targets for bullet impact in berm
- GUB 2 Authorized CCW Instructors given priority – check calendar before use.




RIFLE RANGE

- Designed for rifle Use only
- All rifle calibers allowed (except .50BMG)
- All shooting takes place from bench or prone positions under shade structure
- Berms at 100 and 200 yards
- Truck path on the right side for quicker target set up and changes
- All shooters must be behind benches before shooting commences
- Con-x contains target stands and frames
 - Members supply own targets
- Brooms provided for clean up of spent shell casings



DEDICATED STEEL RANGES

- 3 steel ranges
 - Pistols (behind pistol range)
 - Rifles (East of Rifle range)
 - Rimfire .22's <u>only</u> (east of rifle steel range)
- Only pre-staged steel targets allowed on these ranges
- Do not set up target stands at these ranges



SHOTGUN RANGE

- Only shotguns may be used
- The largest size of shot allowed is 7 ½
- Automated thrower during pre-approved scheduled events
- Manual Thrower
 - Always available
 - Follow instructions on bench
 - Use own clays
- Shotgun Patterning Board
 - Only shotguns allowed
 - No shot larger than 7 ½ allowed





SPECIAL EVENT BAYS

These 12 bays are for scheduled events only, as shotgun range closure is required. These events include IDPA, Steel Challenge, and other Traditional and Action events. All members and guests are encouraged to participate in these events which can be found on the website calendar.



Range Policies, Reminders & Safety Tips...

- Please wear your badge at all times when at the range
- Members may bring guests to the range
 - ★ Keep them with you at all times
 - 2 guests may shoot at one time under member observation
 - If member is shooting only one guest may shoot at the same time
- Our method of communication with members is via email
- Let someone know when you head out to the range and when you will return —cell reception is spotty
- ☑ Check the website calendar before heading to the range

No presentation, video or pamphlet can cover every possible scenario you might encounter at the range. Use good judgement and common sense and contact a Board Member with questions or concerns



Range Policies, Reminders & Safety Tips (continued)...

- There is no running water or electricity at the range
 - Be aware of lead contamination wipes are a recommended item in your range bag
- You are responsible for cleaning up after yourself
 - Trash barrels are at all ranges
 - Extra trash bags are in the con-x
 - Dumpster is beside the road on the way out of the range
 - Ammo cans at pistol and rifle range
 - Please use for ammo that did not fire
 - Plastic buckets at shooting stations for spent shells
 - If you reload brass in plastic buckets is there for you to recycle

LLGC range policies and standard operating and printed on the LLGC range bag or vehicle

Range Policies, Reminders & Safety Tips (continued)....

Fire danger is high please follow no smoking / vaping signs at the range

.50 BMG, armor piercing, tracer or incendiary rounds are <u>not</u> allowed at the LLGC range.

No green tip ammo on steel range.

Alcohol is not permitted at the LLGC range

Bump stocks are not allowed at the LLGC range
